Please read the following carefully. I realize this is a lot of information, but we have had to make several changes this year to keep everyone safe during a worldwide pandemic. A HUGE Thank You to the many volunteers who have put in countless additional hours this year as we have worked together to form solutions to challenges we didn't know existed a few months ago. I realize that not everyone will be happy with how everything will look this year, but please keep in mind that we have had to implement these changes in order to provide in-person judging. While our situation is not ideal, I am proud of the hard work many people have given to our program to help make these events happen.

COVID-19 Safety Plan

Families have received the Allen County COVID-19 Safety Plan that has been approved by Purdue University. This plan was written over the course of several weeks of meetings with the Allen County 4-H Board of Directors and Livestock Executive committees with guidance from the Allen County Department of Health. This plan was not written to merely check off a box, but to insure people's safety during our in-person 4-H events. A few highlights of the plan are:

- **Face coverings are required when adequate social distancing of six (6) feet cannot be maintained. For Swine, this will be whenever you are in the show ring.** We will ask that everyone on the grounds respect this request for the health and safety of our 4-H members, families, volunteers, and staff.
- One volunteer per specie will be responsible for handling scales to avoid being touched by each family.
- We will not have bleachers open. People will need to bring their own seating for shows and will be reminded of social distancing when setting up seats and throughout shows.
- The Allen County 4-H Board has purchased 12 gallons of hand sanitizer and dispensers that will be placed around the grounds along with signage on the importance of proper hand hygiene.
- Our food booth will have a limited menu of bottled water, soft serve ice cream, and pre-made sandwiches. Families will be able to bring their own food to shows. Food and beverages will be discouraged in barns.
- We ask that anyone exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 in the past two (2) weeks refrain from attending any 4-H events. Individuals with symptoms of COVID-19 will be asked to go home.
- **Each 4-H member will be issued a wristband for each species they are exhibiting when they check-in the day of each show. In addition, EACH IMMEDIATE HOUSEHOLD will receive an additional three (3) wristbands for that show. Everyone on the fairgrounds (with the exception of people picking up non-livestock exhibits) MUST have a wristband. Wristbands are color coded by species. To help us maintain appropriate social distancing and maximum numbers of attendees, those without a wristband will be asked to leave the fairgrounds.**
- **There are still several unknowns and things will continue to change. Please model patience and flexibility as we all work together to be able to provide in-person judging.**

Purdue University has made special exemptions to university guidelines for Extension and 4-H to hold summer events with the promise that these approved plans would be followed. It is all of our responsibility to make sure everyone is following the details of this safety plan.

Livestock exhibitors are expected to:

- Have successfully completed their livestock activity sheets and records by June 30 and submitted them to the Extension Office. Any member not having done so by June 30 is still eligible to show their animal, will receive a completion ribbon, and not be eligible for any showmanship classes. Exception: Horses are NOT eligible to show.
- ALL 4-H Exhibitors should have completed Fair Entry by July 15th.
- **YQCA** Youth planning on exhibiting at the Indiana State Fair MUST complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) online by the time animals are checked in at the State Fairgrounds. The link for YQCA is <http://yqca.org/>. There is a \$12 cost to complete YQCA. This is paid directly to YQCA, not 4-H.
- **If you are showing livestock in ALLEN COUNTY ONLY:** Due to CODID-19 adjustments, this year youth exhibiting livestock at the COUNTY LEVEL ONLY have the option of completing online Animal Ethics modules instead of Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). These modules MUST be completed by Friday, July 17, 2020. There is no cost for these modules. The online Animal Ethics modules can be found here: <https://extension.purdue.edu/4h/Pages/Online-Animal-Ethics-Program.aspx>. The four sections that must be completed are listed under the Online Animal Ethics Modules.
IMPORTANT – Youth MUST complete the following Qualtrics survey to receive credit for the Animal Ethics modules: https://purdue.ca1.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_2aAOaEAK0BEGoRv
- Health paperwork is not required for animal exhibition. However, Cattle, Goats, Sheep and Swine will be checked by committee members upon arrival. Horses, Llamas, Poultry and Rabbits will be checked at their barn as only healthy animals will be allowed to be stalled or penned.
- Again, this year – all swine will have temperatures upon arrival prior to unloading.
- Set up and Clean-up will happen before show (or evening before). Please check with committee members to see if you can assist with set up of the livestock barns as needed. Stall/pen assignments will social distance practices will be made at the discretion of the livestock committees. Priority will be given to ensure we have adequate space for animals rather than tack. Exhibit Committees are going to use barns that are available, not per species as has been the case in other years.

Animal Check in at East Gate.

- You MUST declare at weigh in/check in what your intentions with your animals are: i.e. Take Home OR Auction OR Consign.
- **Animal Medications** - Reminder that if you are selling your animals be sure that the animals are drug free. Animals that have been fed medicated feed or given medical injections should not be sold if the drug withdrawal time is beyond July 28.
- **Weigh-In Posted in newsletter** – Committee members and Allen County 4-H Board will assist with weigh-ins. We will try to weigh one household at a time then we will have to sanitize after that household and move on to next household. You may be near the scales but we need to limit the amount of contact for sanitizing reasons.
- **All Bedding will have to be removed after each show. Manure spreaders and wheelbarrows will be available for manure and bedding materials BUT YOU MUST BRING YOUR OWN SHOVELS, RACKS, ETC for sanitization reason.**
- **Livestock Shows are “No Fit” Shows in 2020 – that means clip and wash at home.** You must provide your own hoses if you need to rinse your animals.
- Electrical fans should have guards or cages on them to protect people from sticking things in them.
- Electrical cords, if used, need to be single use or connected to a power strip that has a circuit breaker. **Please Bring GFI power strips. No three-way cords allowed. The Fire Marshall will not allow use of cords with multiple outlets on the end. Cords cannot be located or placed under bedding material or wrapped.**

MANURE MANAGEMENT:

- Please dump manure to the back of the cement manure pit. Do NOT leave it by the entrance.

ANIMAL LIABILITY:

- Reminder that owners of any animals at the Fair are responsible for any/all damages that the animal may do to other animals, visitors, or buildings. Take extreme caution when moving or working with your animals at all times. Make sure that they are properly fed, watered, exercised, and have clean stalls.

Additional Information for your Species

SHOW ATTIRE for everyone:

Show attire is long pants, closed heel and toe shoes, tucked in shirt with capped sleeve. See specific species for additional expectations. Volunteers working livestock shows should comply with 4-H'ers show attire (refer to 4-H Rule Book).

- Enter Allen County Fairgrounds through East Drive entrance.
- All will have to bring their own chairs (no bleachers) and stay with their group keeping 6 feet away from other groups. Those who enter the Horse Barn must wear a mask. No mask needed for those in the arena if they stay 6 feet apart.

9:00 am Showmanship Class

- Seniors, Intermediates then Juniors (No more than 8 per group showing at one time). The Judge, Tami Lash, has agreed to no grooming judging (judge the child only) and no hand contact and maintain a 6 feet distance from those in the ring.

½ hour after Showmanship, we will do Mini performance courses (with 5 walk through obstacles, no hand touch obstacles).

We will then do Obstacle Course and PR Course classes with 8 walk through obstacles, no hand touch obstacles. Each division will have the same obstacle lay out, but may move differently. We will run Juniors, Intermediate then Seniors.

- We will come and bring your animal to the scale and weigh them in and return them to you.
- Must declare at this time if animal going home or auction or consign. (If auctioning dairy beef animal then they are not eligible for Indiana State Fair Show)

- Use the wash rack. Bring your own hose to use. Please clean up any items and manure piles after using the wash rack. Reminder no generators can be placed within 25 feet of the wash rack for safety purposes. Observe social distancing.

Saturday, August 1, 2020

Swine

Pre-show day – If you will be showing carcass gilt or barrows or didn't pick up your ear tags at the County Extension office, reach out to Pam Ott – 260-402-3434 or see her at the Fairgrounds.

Our goal is to have as much paperwork completed prior to show day as possible. On Saturday, we want to be able to focus on crossbred gilt & all barrow class breaks after weighing & carcass results after scanning is completed. Purebred gilt classes will be broken prior to Saturday, except for changes which may be needed with checking purebred gilt papers.

Show day timeline & direction:

Check-In: 6:00 -8:00 am

- Enter Allen County Fairgrounds through East Drive entrance. No bedding will be supplied. Only put down minimal bedding in the barns. You will be expected to clean your area before you leave. Wheel barrels will be provided. Please bring own shovels for cleanup.

6:00-9:00 am

- All crossbred gilts, all barrows, all carcass gilts & all consignment gilts will need to go to the scales to be weighed at the east side of the Show Barn.
- All carcass barrows & gilts will need to be scanned at the east end of the Show Barn.
- Purebred gilts & papers will need to be checked in the showing.

If a volunteer opens a gate at the scales, scanning, entering the make-up area or exiting the show ring, please let them. This eliminates sanitizing after each person handling the gates.

If auctioning swine animal then they are not eligible for Indiana State Fair Show.

6:00-11:00 am

- Able to use the wash racks, 1 pen/family with no feeding in the wash racks. Bring your own hose to use. Please clean up any items and manure piles after using the wash rack. Reminder no generators can be placed within 25 feet of the wash rack for safety purposes. Observe social distancing.

10:30 am: Mandatory meeting for all Swine exhibitors

- All swine exhibitors and helpers in the show barn. **Due to the challenges of keeping pigs at least six (6) feet apart, all Swine exhibitors and ring stewards are required to wear face coverings in the Show Barn.**

11:00 a.m. Allen County Swine Show Starts

- Show order: Purebred gilts, Crossbred gilts, Purebred barrows, Crossbred barrows, Pair of barrows, Showmanship – Senior, Intermediate, Junior & Novice
- Enter swine on the south end of the show barn. The make-up area will be on the south side of the show barn. Please observe social distancing between families and swine.
- Exit swine on the east/north corner of the show barn. Please observe social distancing between families and swine.
- 1 hour after regular swine show ends – Allen County Carcass show begins

Additional information:

- Picture area will be available to use. Please observe social distancing when using.
- Generators will be allowed outside of the barn area and around trailers. Keep at least 25 feet from any wash rack and be considerate of others when using.
- Release to go home can begin after you are done showing for the last time. You must clean up your bedding where your swine were penned or out by the trailer. Bedding to be placed in the manure pits before you leave. Make sure your pigs have been watered in the last 10 minutes before you leave for home.
- Consigned pigs will be leaving on the buyers trailer the evening after the show.

LIVESTOCK AUCTION INFORMATION

The 2020 Allen County 4-H Livestock Auction will be an online auction. The auction will feature the livestock 4-H member only and their efforts with their livestock. It will be premium only, no one will be buying or receiving your animal. There will be three options for 4-Hers to actually part with their animals.

Option 1 - We are teaming up with Hoosiers Feeding the Hungry to **purchase** any or all of your animals at a fair market value following each show.

Option 2 - There is also an opportunity to **donate** your animal to Hoosiers Feeding the Hungry if you so choose.

During weigh in at the fairgrounds you will be asked to indicate if you wish to participate in Option 1, 2 or 3. If you select to participate in Option 1 or 2, at the completion of each livestock show, there will be a trailer available. Your animal will need to be on the check off sheet that was completed at weigh in to be eligible to load your animal on to the truck.

Option 3 – The 4-Her will take the animal home after the show.

If the 4-H Member has completed a livestock project listed below, they will be able to participate in the online auction. Each member can only be listed one time. Projects may include:

Beef Steers

Dairy Beef Steers and/or Feeder Calves

Grand Champion Dairy Cow [sell milk]

Grand Champion Dairy Goat [sell products]

Goats: Meat Goat Wether or Dairy Goat Wether

Swine Market Barrows or Market Gilts

Sheep Market Lambs

Poultry: Pair of Broilers or Turkey or 1 Dozen Eggs [from Champion or Reserve Champion Layer]

Rabbit: Meat Pen, Roaster, Single Fryer or Stewer

The Livestock Auction will be available online Sunday, Aug 2nd at noon through Tuesday, Aug 4th at noon for your buyers/supports to place their bid.

If you would like to participate in the livestock auction please email the following information to allencoin4hauction@gmail.com. You can begin submitting your information at any time. The deadline to submit this information and participate in the online auction is Monday, July 27th. (After showing your animal if you earn an award that you would like to add to your information, you may do so by Saturday, August 1st @ 7pm.) If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Auction Committee Chairman, Randy Lewis @ (260) 438-5382. The auction fee is \$20.00/lot. This amount will be deducted from your check. The following information will be displayed on the website for bidding:

- Member's Name

Understanding how the Livestock Auction Works

Buyers will need to register online to bid at www.showpig.com. Buyers will be able to bid any amount toward the 4-H Member and their efforts.

Etiquette for asking for support in the Auction

BEFORE the Livestock Auction:

- Write them a letter and mail it to them, or hand deliver it to them.
- If you hand deliver the invitation—be sure to be well dressed. Consider this like a job interview. Keep in mind that it is harder for someone to say no to you if you visit them in person!
- Invite them to participate in our online Livestock Auction, tell them the date and website. Tell them you would appreciate them bidding on your project and supporting the 4-H members in Allen County. See Sample letters.
- Make these contacts PRIOR to the Livestock Auction. You should be contacting these potential buyers from now to the auction.
- If you happen to be the Grand Champion in _____ and wish to let the people you contacted earlier know—it is OK to call them during the week of the Fair and tell them “I was the Grand Champion Swine Barrow at the Fair, and I plan to sell my barrow in the Auction. I invite you to come and bid on this animal.”

Show Day
